

3 New Nub's Nob Slopes

Now 52 runs at Michigan's #1 Ski Resort

Harbor Springs, Michigan – Out of the Northern Michigan hardwoods Nub's Nob, Michigan's top ski resort according to the Detroit News 2005 readers survey, has swung their chainsaws again and cut a huge addition of 3 expert slopes for the 2005-06 ski and snowboard season.

The Tower Glades, named for the communication towers atop this newly accessed peak, will provide the first ever "hike-in" expert terrain in the state. Much like big resorts in the west, the new tree filled expert slopes will provide backcountry skiing inside the boundaries of Nub's Nob. It's a 10 acre addition bringing Nub's skiable acreage to 248.

"The Southern Comfort, Arena and Powerline Glades are some of the most popular runs for our advanced to expert customers" said Nub's Nob area manager, Marty Moore. "So we've added 3 more steep expert gladed tree slopes giving Nub's 52 total runs. They're in a fantastic new area off a new peak that's never been skied or ridden before."

Moore smiled, "This is some real steep stuff and expert skiers and riders will have to hike in to get it, just like out west." Rising hundreds of vertical feet above the Home Run slope the new Tower Glades are accessed by a climbing trail off the Ramblewood run.

"Expert tree riding and skiing fans will love the Tower Glades" Winter Sport Schools Director Scott Stillings said. "I've hiked and skied most of the Tower area and it is steep and very cool. Backcountry fans with fat skis are in for a great year at Nub's!"
